Thank you for your support with drop off and pick up times, punctuality and attending school, alongside our Covid 19 procedures, which are currently still in place; it really does make a difference especially as cases seem to be on the rise again. We have outlined our Covid 19 routines and expectations in our Westwood Family Handbook and Risk assessment. Some of the key points were:

- Please keep your family close and safe around the school site at all time. This includes children who may attend for drop off and pick ups.
- · Social distancing wherever possible on the school grounds is recommended but not compulsory.
- · Please refrain from gathering around the school gates and keep the pavements clear in the morning at drop off and at collection of your child/children.

Please keep to the drop off and pick up times – a few families are consistently arriving late and this is very unsettling for the children, disruptive to our staff and for our school routines. Please keep to your drop off times. The office is incredibly busy after we come in after the gates and if we are continually disturbed, it affects the running of our whole school. If you need support with punctuality, speak to Mrs. Thomas or Mrs. Williams. Keep to our times please.

Father's Day Event – Burger & Brew





Our Project for Safer Routes to Westwood Community Primary School.

Alongside our traffic safety and parent's parking promise, we have now managed to get a lollipop operative outside Westwood, to assist our Westwood Family to get to school safely. A huge welcome to Sandra, our Lollipop operative, and our newest Team Westwood member! Thank you to Mrs Drury and Claire Parry from FCC for making this happen:)





Mrs Drury, one of our Parent Governors campaigning for safer routes to our school, spoke to the children during our assembly regarding safety and we know the children want to be safe around their own school. They agree parking outside school must stop!



NOTE: Please try not bring cycles and scooters to school at this time, as we cannot store them nor is the parking outside our school allowing our children safe passage around the streets around school. We hope that you will please park considerately around school, using the local car parks and keeping outside the school clear. We were hoping to provide a safe place for bikes and scooters to be brought and stored on school but until the traffic and parking improves outside school, we will not be able to action this. Thank you for your support and considerate actions going forward.

Pupil Safety around school

As you will appreciate, keeping our children safe is our number one priority! In nearly every piece of correspondence from myself, I am highlighting the dangers of thoughtless parking outside school. We are working with Flintshire County Council on our Parents' Parking Promise. Mrs Drury, One of our Parent Governors campaigning for safer routes to our school, spoke to the children regarding safety and we know the children want to be safe around their own school.

We have sent home a Parents' Parking Promise for you to sign and for your child to return to school. Thank you to the promises we have received so far—your support means a lot. We are very serious about this - outside school is an accident waiting to happen. We know it will - it happens all over the UK.

It happened to a little boy called Bobby, who was 6 years old. He was killed by a van due to dangerous parking and driving around school. I have put the links to his story here:

Parents' Parking Promise

Parking too near to school entrances puts children in danger

The area outside our school is busy in the morning and at the end of the school day. Parents who park close to entrances act irresponsibly, potentially placing children in danger. The parking restrictions are in place to maintain an area free from parked cars, this allows children and parents walking in and out of school to cross safely, where they can see and be seen by approaching traffic.

We are asking all parents to promote considerate parking and promise to the following;

- · Never park on any of the parking restrictions
- · Never to park across drives, even for a few minutes
- Never to park on pavements in a way which prevents pedestrians, disabled users or parents with buggies from using the pavement

Please also remember that walking to school is a great way to become healthier and can positively contribute towards improved psychological welfare and better academic performance along with the potential benefits that physical exercise can bring.

Please help us by completing the tear off slip below. By returning this you are undertaking to keep parked cars away from the area outside of school, therefore protecting the safety of all the children who attend our school.


Our House Captains & KiVa Ambassadors News!




Find social groups that help them feel like they belong.
