Finally, a huge thank you for the massive improvement in the parking outside school on Tabernacle Street. We appreciate this so much, as it ensures our children can be safe outside their own school. Please can we ensure this is also happening at the Padeswood Entrance (Breakfast Club and Reception Entrance) as some children are running across the road from cars to this entrance.

#### **Outdoor Area Improvements**

At Westwood we are in the process of developing our Outdoor play and learning experiences for the children.
