


Remembrance Day 2020

The Play Futures Project has arrived!!

Over the past five weeks Year 4 have been working hard on a project to improve break times during the school day. They have been working alongside Simon Bazley, a freelance Play Consultant and Trainer who developed the programme in direct response to the needs of schools across North East Wales.

<u>Session 1:</u> During the first session, Year 4 looked at the overall project in more detail, the 'right to play' and the expectations of becoming Westwood's Play Champions.


<u>Session 2:</u> The second session required the children to become 'Play Doctors', they collected data on what the other children thought of play times during the school day. A questionnaire was given to each class in Key Stage 2 to complete. The children also learnt how to make a paper popper in this session.

Session 3: Year 4 became 'Play Detectives' and discussed the results of their findings from Session 2. The children also took part in a variety of games they could use on the playground, including a very fun way of playing rock, paper, scissors!

<u>Session 4:</u> PLAY! PLAY! This session involved the children using the equipment in the shed for the very first time. The shed has been placed on the Key Stage 2 yard and inside there are lots of objects the children can use to create their imaginative games- it's amazing what a cardboard box can turn into!









<u>Session 5:</u> What if? This session allowed the children to reflect on what they had learnt in the previous sessions, from fun and exciting games to keeping themselves safe during play times. This session also including games on how to build paper aeroplanes.

Along with some of the staff at Westwood, the 'Play Champions' of Year 4 have now opened the shed for the other children to use during break times. Now let's go and play! :)

Health & Safety for our Westwood Family

Health and safety around and on the site remain of the highest priority. I urge you again to read the Parent handbook and previous correspondence We have been incredibly safe at school and our school community has been amazing observing our new structure, social distancing and safety measures.

Just to remind you that when we return in the Spring term we are still requesting that all adults / parents / carers who come onto the school grounds to wear a face covering please. Please ask for a lanyard if you are exempt from wearing a face covering.

Furthermore, if you have a child or family member from another school / college who are not in school/ college due to their year self isolating, do not bring them to the school site nor send them to pick up siblings or family members.

If you need support, I am always on the gate or you can email school.

Colds / Flu / Covid -19 Communications

If your child is poorly, we ask you let us know they will not be in school. Even if you have told us, and your child attends Penguins, you must let them know too and vice versa. On a couple of occasions, I have been contacted by Penguins who have passed on information. Please keep both settings informed at all times. Thanks:)

Also as cold and flu season is upon us, we have a few children who are absent with colds, sickness bugs etc. I would ask you watch the video that was sent to you to give you advice of the symptoms of colds and Covid. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TTDbNz-1F3c&feature=youtu.be

We are clear that the symptoms we consider as Covid are:

- A new continuous cough
- High temperature
- Loss of taste or smell

You will be aware of this from the correspondence we have sent out and the procedure we will activate if your child presents with these symptoms in school.

<u>Please re read the parent handbook and the risk assessment to be clear of this.</u> We are here to help but this has been outlined on many occasions with the testing procedures available too.

If you, members of your household or your child are presenting with Covid-19 symptoms, please stay at home, book a test online https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/testing-and-tracing/get-a-test-to-check-if-you-have-coronavirus/ or though the 119-phone number.

If you have booked a test, are considering a test or have been advised by your doctor to call for a test, please do not send you child into school.

Once you have your test results returned, please notify us. Only negative results will allow a return to school, and as long as no one in your home is symptomatic / well enough to attend school. We must keep our school community safe and we will support you if at all possible.

On the opposite page is an easy guide on what to do in in these difficult times and if you, or your child becomes unwell with symptoms.

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School News

Breakfast club

Breakfast club and Westies Breakfast Club (for Nursery & Reception) are now open for bookings on the School Gateway (Comms) app.

Schoolgateway



All the bookings are to be made on the School Gateway (Comms). Bookings must be made in advance, even if it's the 8.30-9.00 slot. The later time slots of 8.30 to 9.00 are capped at 20 places maximum, booked in advance – this is to keep our numbers conducive for social distancing between contact groups. If you don't already have the School Gateway app, please download it, put in your contact email and telephone number which we have on the school system, this will link you to your child's account. Any problems with this system feel free to contact the office.

Online learning resources and home support with reading

If your child is poorly or unable to come into school for whatever reason, we can support you with work. If your child is able to complete work from home, they can do so.

If your child is in Juniors, your child can access Study ladder, Read Theory, My Maths. Spellings for all year groups will be also available on the class pages. You also can read with your child 4 times a week. It is important that regular spelling and reading practice is maintained at home for all children to support us with our recovery curriculum.

If your child is in Foundation phase, you will have access to a learning grid on your child's class page and Seesaw. Your class spellings for Year 1 & 2 will also be on the class pages. Your child can read their reading books 3 times for the week too. It is important that regular spelling and reading practice is maintained at home for all children to support us with our recovery curriculum.

There are lots of further resources on Hwb for Blended Learning, if your child has their password. New nursery and pupils new to school may need help with passwords for the online platforms. Please contact the office who can forward your request for password help to the class teachers.

Outdoor learning Grants

As you know, at Westwood we are in the process of redeveloping our Outdoor play and learning experiences for the children. We are hoping to soon create a new forest school area, community garden and outdoor classroom during the Spring term. We were lucky pre Covid to secure grants for these projects. We are still looking at further improvements in the Outdoor area and need help with this.

Our New Normal

We know that your child is enjoying the many aspects of the new 'normal' we have established including Wellbeing and outdoor activities, despite the horrible weather at times,

Welly Wednesday is super popular, when they can wear their **own suitable outdoor clothes** for outdoor activities to allow you to catch up with the uniform cleaning mid week. Our Daily Mile is being incorporated with the classes through school.

P.E. kit to be worn on their P.E. days- can I remind you to pop on your school cardigan or sweatshirt over your P.E. kits please? P.E. day isn't an own clothes day. Your child's class may be involved in additional P.E. Sessions too. Please look out for information from class teachers.

Also I must remind you of our policy on school uniform, which can be found on the website. Many children have returned wearing jewellery; chains, drop earrings and looped earrings which are not allowed due to health and safety - studs and small sleepers are acceptable, which must be removed for P.E. or plasters provided.

Long hair should be tied back for health and safety reasons. We also have a few children with dyed hair, which we say within the school uniform policy isn't accepted. I understand during lockdown and holidays, that hair styles and colours may be changed however we must request that now we are back in school, we follow the policies set out which you support as part of the home / school agreement. I thank you for your support here.

We would like also to remind adults who are collecting children to ensure only one adult per family enters the site, keeping the entrances / exits clear, wear your mask and observe strict social distancing please at all times. Please also be prompt and as close to your time as possible dropping off your child & collecting your child and leaving the site swiftly. This it ensures our staggered times are effective, safe and well managed for all of our Westwood Family.

Finally, a huge thank you for the massive improvement in the parking outside school on Tabernacle Street. We appreciate this so much, as it ensures our children can be safe outside their own school. Please can we ensure this is also happening at the Padeswood Entrance (Breakfast Club and Reception Entrance) as some children are running across the road from cars to this entrance. Also please keep your children close and safe, around the school site. Diolch!
