
ELVES AT WESTWOOD

Reminders - Use of Social Media Platforms and Age Appropriate Material

During lockdown, many children may have increased their usage of Social media, online gaming and access of films. Unfortunately, not all of these platforms are appropriate for their age.

Whilst we know that our parents our incredibly vigilant, social media changes rapidly and new platforms are popping up, making it more difficult to keep a close watch on activity. As a parent it's also important you know that all social networking platforms (or social networking apps, if on a smartphone) have age limits. Some social networks use technologies that may not be right for some ages or engage with communities that are made up of people much older than your child.

So what are the risks of using an underage social networking account?

There are many risks when your child uses an unsupervised account or makes an account on a social network site that is not age appropriate. So what are the risks of an underage social networking account?

- Many sites include an instant message function that allows private conversations between site members.
- Most social networking sites have an app version available, meaning your child will have access to the social network from their smartphone or tablet. Some app versions of social networks use the location of the phone.
- Information shared between friends can be easily copied and may spread.
- It isn't easy to take back information that has been posted and can be impossible if it's already been shared.
- Not everyone your child meets online will be who they say they are. Chatrooms and forums can connect people who are complete strangers and can be unmoderated.
- Chatrooms and forums are some of the places online groomers go to connect with children. This is sometimes done through video chat programs. They can also be places where people use a lot of inappropriate language and engage in online activities with people who may be a lot older Or not who they say they are.

Top social networks for kids

If your child is eager to start tweeting, posting or sharing but they struggle to find a network that is suitable for their age, then there are a number of alternative social networks made for children that you can point them to.

These offer child-friendly features like games and contests but also give you a chance to use them as teaching tool to get them sharing safely.

Ultimately, these social networks give children a safer environment where they can share their experiences and engage with friends they know.





Sad news for our Westwood Family

As many of you know Mrs Fresa, Class 3's teacher, has been poorly and absent from school since February.

Up to now, we have respected Mrs Fresa's wishes, by keeping her absence information confidential, as this is a very difficult time for Mrs Fresa and her family. However, she feels it is now time for our wider school community to know why she has been absent from school. Class 3 had this sad news shared with them earlier last week.

Tragically, Mrs Fresa had a miscarriage in February. This tragic loss was followed by the devastating news that she has cancer. Mrs Fresa is undergoing a long period of treatment for her cancer diagnosis but the prognosis is positive. This does mean, that sadly, Mrs Fresa will not be able to return to school for this academic year.

Given the age of the children in class 3, we have not shared any of this information with them nor with any of the pupils at school. We feel it would be very upsetting for our children, as it has been for all of the staff, colleagues and friends of Mrs Fresa since we learned of her sad news. We do trust that if you wish to tell your child, you may do so. However, can you inform us of this so we are aware and mindful of how your child may react and we can support as necessary. Thank you to the parents of Class 3 for your support of Mrs Fresa.

We know that your thoughts and well wishes will be with Mrs Fresa and her family at this sad and difficult time. If you have been affected by this news, please contact the office.
