Dear Parent/Guardian,

We are the Eco committee members and we hope you can help us.

In an effort to engage pupils in small environmental initiatives that can have a big impact, our school is participating in a week-long **Waste-Free Lunch Challenge** that begins next Monday, May 20th, 2019.

The challenge is part of Westwood's 'Eco Week'. School lunches are a source of waste in our school; the average student's lunch generates a total of 30 kilograms of waste per school year, or an average of 8,500 kilograms of waste per school, per year. With your assistance, we can make a great contribution to reducing waste every day.

Please help your child pack waste-free lunches for our event and help us fulfill a number of goals:

- ✓ Celebrate and learn about Waste Reduction Week using the "3Rs" approach to reduce, reuse and recycle so that less waste is created from school lunches.
- ✓ Reduce the cost of waste disposal so the school's resources can be put to better use.
- ✓ Encourage fresh and nutritious lunches (many pre-packaged lunch items contain significant amounts of sodium, preservatives and fat).
- Broaden the understanding of materials that we can recycle, how recycling works and promote recycling in school and at home.
- ✓ Help you reduce the cost of lunches: a waste-free lunch can cost less as there is less packaging to buy.



We have spaces at the moment so if you wish to book in please call into After School Club or the School Office for a registration form.



Penguins Playgroup


Are you looking for a playgroup for your child?


Summer is finally here!!

Morning Routine

As you all know, school doors open at 8.40am. We have a great many of pupils who attend promptly at this time. You will also know that we are fortunate to have a breakfast club, which is funded from 8.10am to 8.40am too. Many of you take up the opportunity to use this fantastic facility for your child. However, we have a few children who arrive on the school site just past 8.30am, unaccompanied and these children are unsupervised; currently we take on supervision of children, who do not use the breakfast club, from 8.40am when staff are on duty.

Unfortunately, as these children are on their own often playing football, incidents could occur, and we are not able to deal with situations until 8.40am. And we would ask for your support with this.

So, in the interests of health & safety, if your child arrives unattended on the school premises up to 8.40am, they will be expected to come into breakfast club.



If you accompany and wait with your child until doors open at 8.40am, then please keep your children close and safe!

There will be no children allowed on the playground before 8.40am.


