Hello Parents & Carers, welcome to our October newsletter. Our newsletter will always offer you an invaluable insight into the world of cWestwood, keep you updated and support the school's website and Twitter as a way of sharing information and improving communication. At Westwood we always have lots to look forward to as it is such a busy school, so here are some of the highlights from the last few weeks and what we have to look forward to in the run up to Christmas. We have had so many events recently and even more exciting opportunities to come!! Where do I start?

We love visitors coming to Westwood and this month we have had lots of interesting events linked to our visits in and out of school!

All the classes had an amazing workshop with Chester Zoo, who shared their expertise with the children on conservation, how plastic pollution is affecting animal life and how we can contribute to a sustainable earth. As part of commitment to recycling and sustainability, we have also been busy collecting and recycling crisp packets at Westwood. As you know crisp packets are not currently recycled by Flintshire and end up in landfill. Each empty crisp packet is worth 1p to the 'Never forget Fund' who research for treatments and equipment to save the baby Asian elephants from the deadly E.E.H.V. virus at Chester Zoo! So far we have collected 8 bin bags full!!! So keep them coming! We would welcome your crisp packets from home, as every crisp packet makes a difference. We have a collection bin in the foyer so please pop them in! We are still collecting for the Dragon Bags, so please fill up and recycle with us!

At the start of October, we held our Harvest Service at Buckley Cross. Reverend Rosemarie always gives us a warm welcome. The children in Year 1 presented a wonderful Harvest celebration, and the children sang their hearts out – especially to 'Riding tractors is Fun!' You, as always, were incredibly generous donating to the Flintshire Food bank this year. Thank you so much for your support!

Our Year 5 & 6 ladies had the opportunity to learn about period poverty from the charity 'Given to Shine', and were given sustainable products to help with feminine poverty. We are the first primary school to have this opportunity and the ladies from 'Given to Shine', supported by Nurse Jackie, were very complementary of our girls who listened intently, and were so polite too.

We have had the local Welsh assembly member, Jack Sargeant visiting us this month and he was blown away by the pupils of the Junior department as they learned about his role in the Welsh Assembly and had a 'grilling' in the Q & A session after his talks. Jack's main focus was to encourage the children to be planet kind, which fit brilliantly into their topic 'Under the Sea.'

As our school is the Buckley Community School, it is so important to us to be at the heart of the community and work in true partnership! We held a community vision event, which allowed contributions into our vision from our stakeholders: parents, pupils and community members. The message of the 'heart of the community' and 'Team Westwood' is a clear theme that has come from all of our vision presentations. Thank you for your support with our new vision!

All of the pupils took to the streets and school locality to take part in our annual litter pick. We had good coverage from the Leader last month, and lots of support from our stakeholders! By the end of our efforts Buckley, yet again, was sparkling. We are very proud of the work we do as a school in the community and the children should be proud of the difference it makes to the town!

On the last day of term, we held our annual Macmillan Event. Despite the weather, you turned out in force to support this worthy charity! The children raised £236.33 in just one hour! Such a tremendous effort and again, I know just how much the children enjoyed being part of the event, supporting our community and making a difference to those in need of our help!

It is important to us that the children have the opportunity to decide on what we contribute to and it is important to them that their voice is heard! The pupil voice is so strong at Westwood, with all children having the opportunity to contribute to councils, groups and within their learning. We had great feedback on this from the Parent's Evening – despite the power cut; it was a very busy and positive night! After half term, the children have chosen their new topic of study – 'Celebrations'! So please talk to your child about the topic and what they would like to learn about 'Celebrations!' It's their curriculum and you play a big part in their learning journey!

Guides is for girls aged 10 to 14. It is held at Westwood from 6.30pm to 8pm on a Tuesday.




### Welcome to our Westies Breakfast Club!



Unless the reason for collections relate to appointments or important arrangements, which a written note or letter confirming this is shown, then we must stress that pupils are only to be collected at home time as it is disruptive to the day and the learning of the children.
